A positive diagnosis of the younger stages of *G. bovis* (i. e., before the head has developed), or of degenerated specimens, is sometimes more difficult; the younger stages and the totally degenerated specimens will not develop further if eaten; the specimens which are only partially degenerated may, however, still retain enough vitality to develop into adult tapeworms. The oval or pyriform body gives a probable diagnosis for the younger stages, while the presence of calcareous corpuscles (seen only with the microscope) furnishes a method of diagnosis for the degenerated forms.
